FME Dean's Regulation No. 6/2005
specifying conditions of awarding a scholarship for study results

Based on the Article 3 of the Scholarship Rules of Brno University of Technology (BUT) this regulation is intended to specify the conditions of awarding a scholarship for study results at the Faculty of Mechanical Engineering (FME).

1. Students of full-time study in bachelor's and master's study programmes, who achieved outstanding study results in the previous period of study, may be awarded a scholarship for outstanding study results up to 80% of the base set per month (Article 3 of the Scholarship Rules of BUT). The scholarship for study results shall be defined based on the weighted average of study results achieved at FME determined according to the Article 14 of the BUT Rules for Studies and Examinations.
2. The scholarship for study results is awarded for the duration of an academic year to a student who meets all the following conditions:
 - a) he/she studied in the previous academic year in the full-time study at FME, and in the given year achieved at least 50 course-unit credits for duly completed compulsory and compulsory-optional courses;
 - b) he/she achieved the weighted average of study results set in para 4;
 - c) he/she does not exceed the standard length of study prescribed for the study programme in the given academic year;
 - d) if he/she studies in the last year of the standard length of study, and he/she achieved in the year before the previous year of his/her study at least 50 course-unit credits for duly completed compulsory and compulsory-optional courses, and achieved the weighted average of study results no more than 1.80;
 - e) on registration he/she applied for awarding a scholarship for study results.
3. The scholarship for study results is awarded for the duration of the summer semester only to a student who meets all the following conditions:
 - a) he/she did not study in the previous academic year in the full-time study at FME;
 - b) he/she met the conditions required for further study after the winter semester of the given academic year, and achieved at least 25 course-unit credits for duly completed compulsory and compulsory-optional courses;
 - c) he/she achieved the weighted average of study results set in para 4;
 - d) in the first two weeks of the summer semester he/she applied for awarding a scholarship for study results.
4. Based on the weighted average of study results, the scholarship for study results is divided into the three following zones:
 - 1st zone: weighted average of study results 1.00 – 1.10;
 - 2nd zone: weighted average of study results 1.11 – 1.30;

3rd zone: weighted average of study results 1.31 – 1.50.

The scholarship for study results for each zone is defined for each academic year by the Dean's Decision.

5. The scholarship for study results according to para 2 or 3, shall be paid for the duration of the academic year, or for the duration of the summer semester respectively. Terms of payments shall be defined by the Dean's Decision.
6. The scholarship for study results shall not be paid when:
 - a) a student finished or interrupted his/her studies;
 - b) it was found that a student evidently does not meet his/her study obligations;
 - c) the decision on the penalty for a disciplinary misdemeanour came into forceIf the decisive factor arises till 10th calendar day of a month, the scholarship shall not be paid in this month. If the decisive factor arises after 10th calendar day of a month, the scholarship shall not be paid from the following month.
7. The scholarship for study results cannot be awarded to students who already graduated from the master's study programme, and to students of bachelor's study programme who are already graduates of a bachelor's study programme.
8. Exceptions to the above mentioned rules may be in reasonable cases approved by the Dean.
9. The regulation comes into effect on 1 September 2005 and replaces the regulation No. 6/2003. The scholarships for study results awarded in the academic year 2005/06 according to para 2 will be defined based on the Dean's Regulation No. 6/2003.

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
