

The Scholarship Rules of Brno University of Technology are registered by the Ministry of Education, Youth, and Physical Education pursuant to Section 36 para 2 of the Act No. 111/1998 Coll. regarding Institutions of Higher Education, and the amendments thereto (Act on Institutes of Higher Education) on 25 May, 1999, under No. 20 244/99-30.

Pursuant Section 36 para 4 of the Act on Institutes of Higher Education, the change of the Scholarship Rules of Brno University of Technology comes into force on 26 May, 2000 under No. 19 706/2000-30.

Complete Version of SCHOLARSHIP RULES Of Brno University of Technology As of 26th May, 2000

Pursuant to Section 9 para 1 b) and Section 17 para 1 g) of the Act No 111/1998 Coll regarding Institutions of Higher Education and the amendments thereto (Act on Institutes of Higher Education), the Academic Senate of Brno University of Technology decided upon the following Awarding Scholarship Rules of Brno University of Technology.

PART ONE

FUNDAMENTAL PROVISIONS

Article 1

Pursuant to Section 17 para 1 g) of the Act No 111/1998 Coll regarding Institutions of Higher Education and the amendments thereto (Act on Institutes of Higher Education), (hereinafter “the Act”), these Awarding Scholarship Rules are internal regulations of Brno University of Technology (hereinafter “BUT”) and include rules for awarding scholarships to students of bachelor, master, and doctoral study programmes at BUT.

Article 2

(1) According to the Articles 3 to 7, it is the Dean of the faculty responsible for the organisational and legal parts of the study programme, where students have been enrolled (hereafter “home faculty”), who decides upon the scholarships. Pursuant Section 91 para 2a) of the Act the Dean awards scholarships for outstanding study results, pursuant to Section 91 para 2 b) to d) and Section 91 para 3 a) of the Act the Dean awards special scholarships, and pursuant Section 91 para 3 c) of the Act the Dean awards doctoral scholarships.

(2) The decision on awarding the scholarship may be delivered personally to students directly at their home faculty or by the post. The decision on awarding the scholarship shall be considered as delivered on the date of its takeover, on the date of the takeover rejection, or after the expiry of the period of three days after its deposition at the Post office. Should the decision delivery fail, it shall be put up on the official faculty board. The date it is put up, shall be considered as the delivery date.

PART TWO

SCHOLARSHIPS FOR STUDENTS OF BACHELOR AND MASTER STUDY PROGRAMMES

Article 3

Scholarships for Outstanding Study Results

(1) A student, who achieved outstanding study results in the previous academic year or in the given period, may be awarded a scholarship for outstanding study results covered by grants up to 80% of the base set up by the Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports monthly (hereafter the Ministry) according to the Section 58 para 2 of the Act (hereafter the base). The scholarship for outstanding study results shall be defined based on the weighted average of study results (Article 15 of the Study and Examination Rules of BUT). Details shall be defined by faculty internal rules.

(2) The scholarship for outstanding study results is paid for the duration of an academic year. Terms of payments shall be defined by a faculty.

(3) The scholarship for outstanding study results shall not be paid for the month, when:

- a) a student interrupted or finished his/her studies,
- b) it was found that a student evidently does not meet his/her study requirements,
- c) the decision on the penalty for a disciplinary misdemeanour came into force.

Article 4

Special Scholarships

(1) A special scholarship covered by grants is a one-off and may be granted mainly in the following cases:

- a) For outstanding study results during the whole study,
- b) For outstanding scholarly, research, developmental, artistic or other creative results contributing to the enhancement of knowledge,
- c) For outstanding sport results, mainly for representing BUT,
- d) For the remarkable activity performed in favour of the faculty, university, or academic staff,
- e) In case of student's strenuous social situation.

(2) Special scholarships covered by grants can also be granted to support Czech citizens studying abroad in the scope of a programme supported by BUT.

(3) Special scholarships covered by grants are granted upon a student's request or upon the proposal of a chief employee of an appropriate department.

- (4) Special scholarships may be granted repeatedly.

PART THREE

SCHOLARSHIPS FOR STUDENTS OF DOCTORAL STUDY PROGRAMMES

Article 5 Doctoral Scholarships

- (1) A student in the full-time form of doctoral study programme can be granted doctoral scholarship covered by grants:
- a) Up to 160% of the base monthly in the first year of the study,
 - b) Up to 240% of the base monthly in the second year of the study,
 - c) Up to 320% of the base monthly in the third year of the study.
- (2) Upon the tutor's proposal and the agreement of the appropriate Subject Council, the Dean can exceptionally award the doctoral scholarship of up to 320% of the base monthly in the fourth year of the study.
- (3) The tutor proposes the amount of the scholarship with respect to:
- a) student's achieved study results,
 - b) student's achieved scholarly results and publications,
 - c) the period of student's previous professional experience,
 - d) student's pedagogical and other activities at BUT.
- The amount of the scholarship can be changed even during the academic year.
- (4) The doctoral scholarship is paid for the duration of an academic year. Terms of payments shall be defined by a faculty.
- (5) The doctoral scholarship shall not be paid for the month, when:
- d) a student interrupted or finished his/her studies,
 - e) it was found that a student evidently does not meet his/her study requirements,
 - a) the decision on the penalty for a disciplinary misdemeanour came into force.

Article 6

(1) Students of doctoral study programmes can be granted once or repeatedly a special scholarship covered by grants for their outstanding study, scholarly, research, development, artistic or other creative results contributing to the enhancement of knowledge.

(2) Students of doctoral study programmes can be granted a special scholarship to support their studying abroad in the scope of a programme supported by BUT.

PART FOUR

SCHOLARSHIPS RESULTING FROM CONTRACTS CONCERNING RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT

Article 7

Students, above all, of doctoral study programmes, can be granted a special scholarship resulting from contracts concluded between BUT and a legal entity providing finance for solving research and development assignments.

PART FIVE

SCHOLARSHIP AWARDED BY THE RECTOR

Article 8

Pursuant to Section 91 para 2b) of the Act, the Rector can grant a one-off scholarship for the remarkable activity performed in favour of the university or as a part of the Rector's Prize. The amount of the scholarship shall be defined by the Rector. .

PART SIX

COMMON, TEMPORARY AND CONCLUDING PROVISIONS

Article 9

Scholarships paid out regularly according to the Articles 4 and 5 are transferred by the bank.

Article 10 **Temporary Conclusions**

In the academic year 1998/99 scholarships are paid to students in accordance with current rules..

Article 11 **Concluding Provisions**

(1) These rules were approved in accordance with the Section 9 para 1b) of the Act by the Academic Senate of BUT on 9 March 1999.

(2) Pursuant Section 36 para. 4 of the Act, the Scholarship Rules come into force on the day they are registered by the Ministry.

(3) These Rules come into effect at the start of the academic year 1999/2000.
